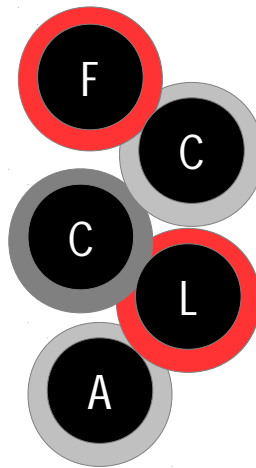

COMETRY came and taught us leadership skills through slam poetry and comedy. It was so fun to listen to Chad and Iggy!



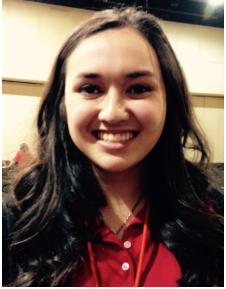

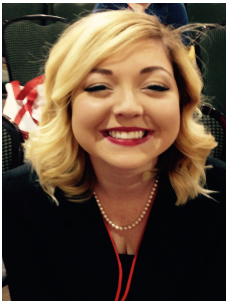

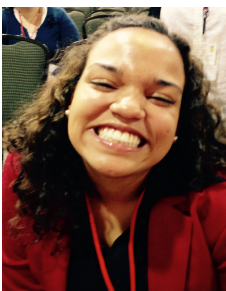
